

Crime Insight Release Notes v4.1.1

Crime Insight version 4.1.1 was released on January 30, 2026.

What's New?

The primary purpose of this release is to support specification updates in Virginia for NIBRS, Use of Force and Community Policing. Additionally, this release includes support for the FBI's 2025.0 specification.

NIBRS 2025.0 Specification

The following changes have been made to support the FBI's 2025.0 specification updates, excluding those changes that are not needed, as agreed by our clients:

- Support for Unfounded offenses within each incident, including new warnings and presentation in the cubes/reports.
- Support for new types of Criminal Activity (Conspiracy and Stolen Firearm) and new complex logic for when each code is permitted/required for each offense.
- Support across all states for injury type Gunshot Wound, including a new error when this injury type is not accompanied with a firearm weapon code.
- Support for Offender Suspected of Using a Drone.
- Support for unknown arrestee sex.
- All warnings, including possible out-of-order submissions can now be disabled on the Site Administration page.
- Error 480, requiring another offense in an incident with circumstance code 08 (Other Felony Involved), has been changed to a warning.
- Error 482 - To match the FBI's logic for error 482 (which previously they were not following), error 482 is now thrown whenever any non-LEOKA offense is linked to a victim type of L, regardless of the other offenses.

The FBI changes not implemented include:

- Error 106, requiring a time for incidents involving LEOKA, has not been removed.
- Error 258, allowing the "automatic" qualifier only for firearms, has not been changed to a warning.
- Error 265, allowing only certain weapons with a Simple Assault, has not been changed to a warning.
- Error 383, requiring a blank property value for seized drugs, has not been changed to a warning.
- Error 475, allowing only one spouse per victim, has not been changed to a warning.

These standard NIBRS changes have been applied to every state implementation. However, for states with XML submissions, they need to be accompanied with a new IEPD (XML specification) version. These will be implemented in upcoming releases.

Virginia Specification Changes

NIBRS:

- A new field has been added to track whether or not a license plate reader was used as part of the investigation into the incident.
- Criminal Activity Type codes related to gang information (J, G, N) are required for most offenses, specifically those for which the FBI will accept these codes.
- Type of Weapon is required for all occurrences of animal cruelty.

Use of Force:

- Now includes the Reporting Agency field. This field is collected and used in reporting in Crime Insight, but is not passed on to the FBI. Instead, all submissions to the FBI indicate that the reporting agency is indeed the state agency collecting the information.

Community Policing:

- Now includes a new code to track that a license plate reader triggered the stop, and a separate field tracks the issue flagged by the license plate reader.

Bug Fixes - Repository and Reporting

The following issues have been addressed in this release:

Who	ID	Description
CO	CO-980	The same error is no longer displayed multiple times at the top of the Single Incident Viewer when a file is uploaded multiple times and the same error exists each time.
VA	VA-530	Processing an EDS file that reports an FBI error no longer fails and reports the error correctly.
All states	CI-2735	Hitting Enter after defining a filter now applies the filter and dismisses the dialog box.
All states	CI-3076	NIBRS incidents that are resubmitted to correct FBI errors are now removed from the NIBRS Errors & Warnings page.
All states	CI-3058	Filtering by Type is Error (or Warning) on the NIBRS Errors and Warnings page now finds all errors, including those reported by the FBI. Also, the criterion for finding just FBI errors (or warnings) is now identified as "FBI Reported Errors" (or Warnings).
